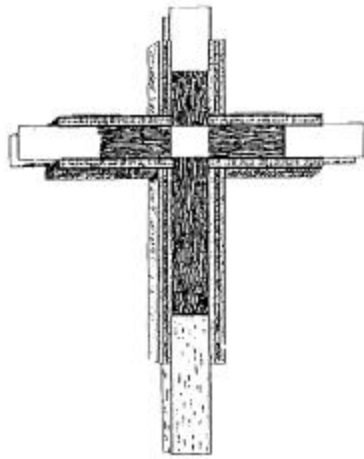

Scott Woolweaver, viola

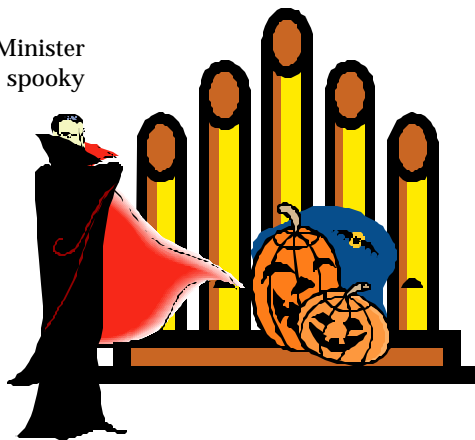

The Saline Fiddlers are America's premier youth fiddling show band. They blend traditional fiddle tunes with a philharmonic size wave of sound. They represent the positive side of today's youth while reflecting the rural traditions of Saline and the United States.

Founded in 1994, the nationally renowned Saline Fiddlers are an elite musical ensemble of Saline Area High School students that have performed more than 900 times in 17 states and 5 countries. They have been honored to perform at the White House, the Kennedy Center, and at hundreds of additional venues, often sharing the stage with many top professional artists and student groups.



The Saline Fiddlers are supported by hours of volunteer labor, donations from appreciative sponsors, sales of recordings, and fees for performing. The group also provides extensive community service through musical performance in and around the Saline area.
